To assist us, we have been directing our attention to a well known prayer- the Prayer of St Francis.

St Francis was born in Assisi, Italy, in 1182. He was an extremely spiritual person who founded the Franciscan Religious Order. This is the prayer that has been our focus for Lent:

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace.
Where there is hatred, let me sow love;
Where there is injury, pardon;
Where there is doubt, faith;
Where there is despair, hope;
Where there is darkness, light;
And where there is sadness, joy.
O, divine master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console;
To be understood as to understand;
To be loved as to love;
For it is in giving that we receive;
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;
And it's in dying that we are born to eternal life."

Each Wednesday at 10am and 6:30pm, we pause during worship and focus on this prayer for our Lenten journey. If you haven't attended these Wednesdays in Lent- NOW IS THE TIME. You and your loved ones will be refreshed. You might also consider coming early for the 6:30pm worship and attend the weekly Soup Supper at 5:30pm. This is a great way to reconnect with folks at Our Savior's and perhaps meet some new people as well. See you at worship!
