Lent 2019

The next season of the Church year greets us as the month of March begins. For Lutherans, it is a season that we are only beginning to appreciate. Growing up as a member of the Augustana Synod (a small Swedish part of the Lutheran Church), Lent was rarely mentioned. For us, Lent was a time that our Roman Catholic sisters and brothers practiced as a part of their mysterious traditions. Indeed, we only knew it was Lent when our friends talked about what they had "given up" for 40 days before Easter or when a black smudge appeared on their foreheads on Ash Wednesday.

Thankfully, we as ELCA Lutherans have come a long way. Today, in the ELCA, and here at Our Savior's, Lent is a powerful part of our spiritual formation. For us it begins a season of reflection, of discernment, and of taking steps to be closer to God. Lent is a season where we focus not on "what we give up" (although some habits might be healthy to give up), but instead, on what new habits and practices we can "take on".

I invite you to join with me on Ash Wednesday, March 6th at either the 10:00 a.m. or the 6:30 p.m. worship service. We will explore the concept of moving closer to God, commune together, and mark our foreheads with ashes to remind ourselves that we are children of God. Taking on something new would be a great way to begin Lent. Come and see how Lent can be a spiritual tool for you!

As a church we will also be taking on something new! On Ash Wednesday from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., "Drive-Up Ashes" will be offered to our community. Your church staff and members of the Worship and Music Team will offer ashes, a brochure inviting those who stop an opportunity to worship with us, and a hot cross bun, which has always been a symbol of Lent. What a great way to reach out to those in our community who, for whatever reason, have not participated in the life of any church.

This year, our weekly Wednesday Lenten Services will take place at 6:30 p.m. only. (No morning services). Here is an idea for you to take on something new. Invite a church member who may not drive at night, and offer to drive them to the Lenten soup suppers which begin at 5:30 p.m., and then worship with them at 6:30 p.m. What a wonderful opportunity for fellowship and a new Lenten practice!

Together we will all take on something new! Thanks be to God!

News From the 2019 Annual Meeting

We had great attendance at the 2019 Annual Meeting on February 10. Thank you to all of you who attended. The following is a summary of important information presented at the meeting.

Karl Wunderlich, our building fund treasurer, gave us an update on the building fund. He reported that our loan balance at the beginning of 2018 was \$491,582. During the year we took in contributions totaling \$235,831. We ended the year with the loan balance at \$352,761 and a cash on hand balance of \$113,417. The cash balance will be reduced by applying a large payment to the mortgage. We will also be holding more in cash to pay for the anticipated replacement of the gymnasium roof. That additional expenditure was part of the fourth capital campaign which we kicked off in May 2018 and will run through April 2021. It is our goal to have the mortgage retired at the end of the campaign.

Tim Moe, our Finance/Stewardship Team chairperson, presented the proposed 2019 budget. The proposed budget is \$439,997 and calls for income to increase over actual giving in 2018 by \$18,202 (a 4.5% increase). Proposed spending is \$439,997 which is an increase over 2018 by \$6,917 (a 1.6% increase). The spending forecast was allocated to different categories: salaries increased by \$26,458, benevolence increased by \$4,113, worship increased by \$1,129, evangelism decreased by \$8,001, confirmation decreased by \$2,964 and buildings and grounds decreased by \$13,941. Consequently, with this budget, we will end 2019 with a projected loss of \$17,697. This is not acceptable and a Finance/Stewardship Team has been formed to implement programs to erase the deficit. The proposed budget was approved by the congregation.

Marcie Kimmes, Ministry Associate, shared information about our new Ministry Teams. Most committees from years past are non-existent and we are re-thinking the way we do ministry. Our goal is to have teams of 5 to 7 people who are passionate about specific areas. Each team will determine the needs of the ministry and how often to come together – whether in person or via email, text, online. We want people to join together to make our ministries vibrant, relevant and impactful. In closing, Marcie asked the meeting attendees, "What inspires you or gives you a sense of purpose? ... What can you offer to your church family?" All members are encouraged to spend some time in prayer then talk with any of the people already committed to moving our ministries forward. See pages 17-18 in the annual report for the Ministry Teams.

Ken Schmidt spoke on behalf of the Call Committee in Rick Carlson's absence. The Call Committee first met with Pastor Amy Engebose of the Synod office on October 10, 2018, to begin the call process. A 14-step process for the Committee to follow was provided by Pastor Amy, and the Committee has found itself at Step 7 for approximately three months. Step 7 is "the Bishop's Office then begins a search process for appropriate names for the Call Committee to interview". The Bishop's Office first provided names at the end of January. The Call Committee will perform telephone first interviews of the candidates the week of February 11. Updates to the congregation from the Call Committee will come when there is news to share.
