I just spent part of a day down at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh at the Lutheran Campus Ministry. Pastor Bryan Schmidt, Campus Pastor, hosted the Appleton Conference for pastors. I try to go to as many colleague things as I can... just to get to know people. We worshipped together and were reminded that we are members of the body of Christ together. My favorite part of the day was when Eric Thompson, one of the students, led our hymns at the top of his lungs. Eric self-identified as being on the Autism spectrum, but it didn't hold him back in any way. His infectious personality and singing warmed my heart.

I credit Lutheran Campus Ministry at UW-Eau Claire as the net that re-captured me in the faith. My brother went to Eau Claire before me and introduced me to Pastor Don Wisner at a little sibling's weekend. Because I look up to my brother, I followed in his footsteps to Eau Claire for college. Little did I know at the time that it would play a big role in my future calling. I was one of the few college students who got up for church nearly every Sunday. "Why...? Because I loved it." I felt like God had a word for me every Sunday as a college student trying to navigate my way through school, relationships, and career decisions. I was especially impressed with how Pastor Don Wisner included so many people in worship leadership and music. He even roped me in to serve communion on a regular basis. This small act of serving got me up on Sunday mornings and made me feel a part of something larger than myself.

While being a part of the Lutheran Student Association at this particular campus ministry, I got the opportunity to go on two mission trips. They were called "Alternative Spring Break trips." Both times a group of mixed race students would go to Washington D.C. to serve people on the margins. One of my favorite experiences was at the Marie Reed Learning Center. Here, we got to read with the inner-city students, play music, and participate in recess. These kids absolutely loved us without even knowing us. I could not believe it, as most relationships don't operate this way. They just were glad someone was paying attention to them. These trips drew me deeper into serving God with the gifts God gave me. I feel most alive when I am serving.

I realize at Our Savior's we have many opportunities to serve. Kasey, our office manager has asked me to make decisions about several opportunities for us to serve in the community. And to be honest, I have no clue what you are passionate about. My standard answer is, we can't do anything without energy and leadership behind each opportunity to serve. If we are going to do things well, I think our Serve and Reach Committee should be the clearing house for all organized opportunities to do mission outside of our congregation. By all means, please continue to serve God in your daily vocations. But I am talking about group things. This could include our feeding ministries, partnering in the community, mission trips, and doing things like the Chili Supper. We were recently asked to reconsider working with St. Paul's Lutheran at their annual Christmas meal. I said sure without checking with any of you. Are you interested in organizing our serving activities and doing perhaps fewer things with more passion? How can we best steward the gifts and time we have to make the most impact? Help!!!

I don't feel equipped yet to make these decisions on my own. And I know you don't want me to volunteer the church for mission without some energy behind it from all of you. Please join the few people on the Serve and Reach committee and let's do some organizing.
