After Jesus accepted her as is and promised her living water that springs up to eternal life, she ran and told the whole village about the man who knew everything about her questionable past and still offered grace.

Here are some examples of the witnessing I have seen at Our Savior's during the pandemic:

We had to learn how to do online worship, Bible studies, Sunday School, and confirmation.

We held outdoor worship and drive-in worship as a worship team.

We held a Zoom book study on anti-racism.

- We had our first Chili-to-Go meal on Election Day raising money for local, national, and global missions.
- We continued to serve meals for Pillars when other organizations were dropping out.

We packed and sent Lutheran World Relief school and health kits and quilts.

We started an 'encouragement ministry' of writing cards to people to keep on keeping on.

We put up the manger scene out front and put new lights on it. It makes me happy every time I drive by.

We delivered 30 poinsettias to homebound folks, thanks to the Hogenson family. I dropped Elaine Anderson's poinsettia off at Dennis and Marsha Anderson's house, and while Dennis was on the phone with Social Security, he said, "The church has been wonderful... sending cards."

- Ashley Stevenson has continued her baking ministry by taking the chocolate chip challenge and sharing her goodies with neighbors, family, friends, and lonely people. I then found out she has been doing this for years. She is also baking for our Pillar's shelter meal.
- Your financial giving has been a witness to me. As a result, we are positioning ourselves well for the future and will be burning our mortgage in 2020.
- Finally, two members asked if I knew any families in need. We are partnering with Shattuck Middle School's counselor to identify families in need and they will be distributing gift cards to families from our church.

These are just the things that came to mind recently. You are also witnessing in your jobs and in your homes.

In John's Gospel, we learn that Jesus is the light of the world. That he is the good Shepard and the bread of life. He will quench their deepest hungers and longings. He is the resurrection and life. The way the truth and the life. We too are called to be like John the Baptist, pointing to Jesus through our words and deeds.

Faith in Action Building Fund Good News!

Thanks to our year-end challenge grant and your financial gifts this past week, we now have enough to burn our mortgage on the building expansion. This is such great news as we can now enter 2021 debt free. On behalf of a grateful church, thank you!

Any outstanding pledges do not have to be paid. However, if you want to redirect your planned gifts, we will not discourage it. You can direct those gifts to funds like our *capital repairs fund* as we will soon need to upgrade our electrical system in the sanctuary and re -do our parking lots. You also can direct those gifts to the unified budget, the foundation, or toward bringing a seminary intern back to our congregation. I will be turning in the seminary application to Wartburg Seminary for an intern this week. The cost of an intern is about \$35,000 a year.

Thank You From Brigade

Over the years, OSLC has become a very valued community partner with the Brigade Christmas Giving Program. This year was filled with changes and challenges. Our Savior's did a lot to help us meet those challenges.

When Our Savior's was told we would not be able to hand out hams this year, your congregation didn't miss a beat. You stepped right up and asked how else you could help. Brigade received requests for assistance from 403 families with 979 children in 2020. We are meeting the requests because of support from people like you. Homebound Communion Ministry

Our Savior's has a very active Homebound Communion Ministry. Communion is given to those folks who are homebound all of the time as well as to those who occasionally get to church, but this doesn't happen consistently. It is also for folks recovering from surgery or rehabilitating after surgery or other conditions. It's a time for visiting, praying, and giving Communion at least once a month. The ministry is a way of staying connected to the church community.

Pillars Adult Shelter Meal Volunteer Opportunity

Our Savior's continues to serve Pillars Adult Shelter every other month on the 4th Thursday, led by Alan Dordel. Alan shared they typically serve dinner to 60-75 persons who are sheltering overnight. We continue what we have been called to do, serving others. There is a designated account for Pillars and if you would like to contribute financially, designate your gift to Pillars. The cost is approximately \$250 to feed 60-75 persons.

To continue this feeding ministry, we need volunteers both to assist in serving at the shelter and to make desserts every other month. We need a total of 6 volunteers per meal as well as 6 dozen desserts.

Details – The Adult Shelter is at 1928 W College Ave, Appleton, WI, behind St Vincent's. The time commitment for serving is a couple of hours. If you are providing dessert, they must be brought to church by the Wednesday before and Alan will transport them.

COVID-19 – All persons staying at the shelter are screened before being registered for the night and wear a mask. Volunteers wear gloves/masks. It is difficult to social distance and while eating, people cannot wear masks, however while serving, people are masked.

If you would like to be on a list of persons that are interested in either serving or making desserts, please call or email the church office and ask to get on the list. A few weeks before you're needed, someone will give you a call to confirm and provide the details.

The next meal is **February 25**. We hope you will faithfully consider it, as your comfort level allows. 2021 serving dates are April 22, June 24, August 26, October 28 and December 23.

'Souper Bowl' Month Reimagined! Fill the Our Savior's Food Pantry

The Our Savior's Food Pantry is a treasure to those who need it. Chris and Sarah Swender faithfully manage this important community ministry. The demand has increased due to an increase in food insecurity in Neenah and the Fox Valley. There are additional options for people in the community, but our faith based, easy to access pantry fills a niche for many and could use some restocking. Chris and Sarah reported the best things to donate are onebowl or one-can meals that can be microwaved or popped open into a bowl. Some examples are shown below. This example cost \$10 at Pick and Save.

OSLC Celebrates 150 Years

On September 9, 1872 a small group of 66 Scandinavians gathered at what used to be the Norwegian Church of Neenah on South Commercial Street, and organized what is now Our Savior's Lutheran Church. Our 150th anniversary is coming up in 2022 and we want to celebrate big! We're looking for all those folks interested in helping to plan an event or events to mark this milestone. New and Old Yamaha Clavinova (Keyboards)

The plan was to announce this in February 2020, but then the world changed. So here we are, almost a year later, making the announcement. The Worship and Music Team were approved by the Memorial Team to purchase a new Clavinova for the sanctuary. It arrived on February 21, 2020 and replaced the Clavinova that was purchased in 1995. We are thankful for the generosity of those who gave memorials and are very excited to begin learning all the features of the new Clavinova.

The old Clavinova had become unreliable with erroneous volumes in the lower and upper octaves of the keyboard. Local repair technicians felt it was not cost effective to try to repair it. We do however, feel it would be usable for a beginning student that will do most of their playing in the middle range of the keyboard. It is being offered free to any member of the congregation that would like it. You will need to make arrangements to pick it up from church no later than February 6, 2021. day School program and other needs of the church.
