*Life Together* 

Dear Our Savior's,

You probably have heard by now that Vicar Kellie's Accelerated Ministry Program internship at Our Savior's has ended as of November 20/21. She was slated to be here for 3 years, but in a mutual agreement with Kellie, Wartburg Seminary, her ELCA Candidacy Committee in Texas, and me as her supervisor, the seminary felt it was best to end the internship now. The plan would be to give Kellie time to be home for Christmas, do a January-term assignment at the Texas border, and to process, and continue her pastoral formation as a residential student at the seminary in the spring. She will be placed at a new ministry site after that. Kellie's ending here will be a new beginning elsewhere on her ministry journey.

The speed and timing of this ending is a shock to the system. Without any warning, many of you heard Kellie give a farewell address to the congregation at the end of both the Saturday and Sunday services this past weekend. One person said to me after service, "this is like a death". And it is. There is real grief and it raises many questions about her leaving. I will do my best here to explain what I can while preserving Kellie's legacy of ministry at Our Savior's.

Wartburg Seminary has offered to be present with us in worship the weekend of November 27/28. The Rev. Stacey Nalean-Carlson, Interim Director of Contextual Education, will be here to preach and help lead worship along with providing more context about Kellie's leaving. She will also thank the congregation for our role in being the first congregation to accept an AMP student as a collaborative learning site and for the love and grace we showed Kellie while she was here.

Now from my perspective: I was feeling for a while that my supervision style and marathon approach to effecting change in the church wasn't a fit for Kellie and her gifts and passions. Behind the scenes Kellie and I had many spirited conversations about theology, social justice, and preaching. Often times I would walk away from our supervisory sessions feeling like things were unresolved and disconnected. I know Kellie felt it too. I started feeling more anxiety within myself and for the congregation as a whole. I don't believe I was in a healthy place to continue to supervise Kellie.

On Tuesday, November 16<sup>th</sup>, I met with the Collaborative Learning Committee and contacted the seminary. I gave Kellie a week off so I could process what I was feeling. They immediately followed up with Kellie and met with her on campus. In speaking with Kellie, the seminary determined that her time here and my supervision would not be a sustainable fit for the long haul. Once that was determined, a plan for Kellie's leave taking was set in motion. Kellie's leave taking was supposed to be the weekend of November 27 – 28 with a representative of the seminary present. But Kellie's dad was coming to help her move, and the timing of his vacation moved her farewell address up to last weekend. She and I met before the service on Saturday and covenanted on the language she would share.

Most of these conversations between Kellie and I happened behind the scenes, and I think both of us realized it wouldn't be healthy to continue. Kellie will be well cared for by the seminary, she will experience daily worship, and be a part of a supportive community of peers. Wartburg felt that Kellie would benefit greatly from being a residential student for a while.

There is a micro and macro piece to Kellie's leaving. There is the part that affects Kellie, me, and Our Savior's. There is big hole that will be left by Kellie's absence among us. She will be greatly missed. It is right to grieve and ask questions. The macro piece is that the AMP program is a new program. For me personally, of the 10 seminary interns I supervised in Oregon, I never had a student with no or very little pastoral formation from the seminary. I need to process how I supervised Kellie more. All of the students I supervised in Oregon came with 3 or 4 years of pastoral formation at Wartburg Seminary and with CPE (clinical pastoral education (chaplaincy) under their belt. The seminary is looking at Kellie's ending here as a way to improve this program going forward.

I am thankful for Kellie's ministry among us. Going forward, I will rely on the help of lay ministers in worship and in confirmation. I will be staffing the Children's Ministry Associate position after a time of healing. We will still have a Christmas program at the 1PM worship on Christmas Eve. Is there a group of parents or caring adults that can help me organize this? It will be simple but meaningful this year. I promise that we will have a Sunday school. I am committed to that. And I hope to staff the gym for the Bible Study that I am leading on the Gospel of John on Sundays.

# Recap of Annual Congregational Meeting

---

We had great attendance again at the Congregational Meeting on November 7, 2021. Thank you to all who attended via Zoom and in person. The following is a summary of important information presented at the meeting.

We voted for Church Council members. Graham Bradley was elected as President and to a second three-year term. Ben Lochner was elected to a second three-year term. Jennifer Baldwin, Marcus Shimon, Carol Swannell and Diane Wilfling were elected to their first three-year term. Welcome Jenny, Marcus, Carol and Diane! And, we thanked and said good bye to Kristi Armstrong who served six years on Council, to President Sue Schultz who served six years on Council and to Secretary Joan Terry who served three years on Council.

We voted for delegates to the Appleton Conference Annual Meeting-Sue Schultz, to Crossways Camping Ministries-Kellie Escovy, to Fox Valley Lutheran Homes-Joan Terry, to the Synod Assembly-Connie and Dewey Wisner and to the 2022 Nominating Committee-Kristi Armstrong and Aaron Zemlock. Thank you all!

Vicar Kellie shared her experiences as a seminarian and as a vicar at OSLC. Her classes are challenging and a lot of work. She hopes to empower more volunteers, continue to improve our youth and family ministries and to share and apply her seminary learnings.

Eagle Scout Bryce Mau presented on the prayer garden he built for us as his Eagle Scout project. The prayer garden is located on the northeast corner of the church property near the bell tower. A formal dedication was held immediately following the meeting. Thank you, Bryce!

Finance and Stewardship Team Chair Todd Stevenson and Treasurer Cheryl Timm presented the proposed 2022 budget and our current financial status. Giving in 2021 is behind budget. Expenses are also behind budget, giving us a positive result through October of \$92,300. We were reminded that \$59,600 of that positive result is from the PPP loan received from and forgiven by the federal government. The proposed 2022 budget shows a total giving number of \$443,300, a total expense number of \$442,939, with a net result of \$361. The adopted budget included an amendment to increase Synod benevolence from \$25,000 to \$26,000. The net result of the 2022 budget is a negative \$639.

Building and Grounds Chair Steve Gries provided an update on our new heating system. The new boiler and baseboard convectors are installed. The changes to the gym heating and air conditioning will take place in the spring of 2022. No more heat worries during the winter!

Serve and Reach Team Chair Pam Garman presented on all the wonderful things Serve and Reach has done and is doing. The Lutheran World Relief group has provided school kits, personal care kits, baby care kits and quilts. The Encouragement team is sending out caring notes. Meals are being served through Pillars and the Fox Valley Community Table. Fundraisers are happening for the Guatemala mission trip. Brigade Christmas giving is in full swing. Volunteers participated in the spring cleanup at the Neenah Animal Shelter. And, Pam has submitted a \$14,000 grant request to the ELCA to cover food for our feeding ministries. This team's enthusiasm is contagious!

Rise Again Team Chair Dr. Rick Klamm reviewed the team's activities this year and how it has followed the science all along in its pursuit to protect us and to allow us to worship in person. Our community spread is still high so we continue to mask and physically distance. Ventilation is upgraded, plexiglass is used in the sanctuary, disposable bulletins and communion cups are used and sign in sheets are used for contact tracing, if needed. Thank you to the Rise Again Team for always thinking about us and to the congregation for its patience.

In Pastor Jon's Church Chat, Pastor said he's been with OSLC for 25 months, 20 of which have been during the pandemic. He gave thanks for his wife, Church Council, Vicar Kellie, Pam Garman and to the many people who made it possible to keep Our Savior's on track during 2020. He announced a new Children's Ministry Associate staff position he would like to fill to provide programming for children from birth to fifth grade. He's excited about the new upcoming adult education class he's leading on the Gospel of John. He pledged to continue clear communication with the congregation. We are blessed to have you among us, Pastor Jon.
