Life Together

On a personal note, I have been reading the book, *The Boys in the Boat: Nine Americans and Their Quest for Gold at the 1936 Berlin Olympics*, by Daniel James Brown. Spoiler alert, the nine young men from the University of Washington Crew Team won the gold medal that year. But their journey to get there was incredible. This book is now being made into a motion picture by George Clooney that will come out in 2023. I am reading the book to learn more about college rowing, as my son, Eli, made the UW-Madison Rowing Team. He made the novice squad after over a month of tryouts.

The thing that is tugging at my heart connected to the book is all the anti-Semitism in the news lately. Didn't we get past this? Kanye West, now known as "Ye", an American rapper, songwriter, record producer, and fashion designer, recently posted some anti-Jewish remarks on his social media account. As a result, the German shoe and clothing maker, Adidas, dropped him and his Yeezy line of shoes from their label, and Jalen Brown from the Celtics and Aaron Donald from the Rams have left his sports agency. Essentially Ye is getting cancelled as people are waking up to the hate language he is spreading. He felt he was untouchable.

In *The Boys in the Boat*, 1936 Germany was trying to paint a façade for the rest of the world of how wonderful and welcoming their county was. As Olympians from all over the world started their way to Berlin, Germany, Hitler had the SA storm troopers gather up men, women, and children who were Gypsies on the streets and ship them to a detention camp. Eventually they would be shipped by rail car to a death camp in the east.

Berlin also removed all of its anti-Jewish signs and propaganda from newsstands as the world gathered in Germany. They wanted everything to look pleasant and peaceful. But behind the scenes, the anti-Jewish fervor was ramping up. Anti-Jewish signs are popping up in America lately.

As Christians, we must do our part to stamp out hate. Jesus was questioned by the religious leaders of his time, "Which is the greatest commandment?" Jesus responded, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and prophets."

That last line is the one that gets me every time. "On these two commandments hang all the law and prophets." Jesus sums up the whole Bible up in these two commandments. All people are our neighbors. All creation is our neighbor. And the love Jesus is talking about is "agape". Agape is the Greek word for love that is unconditional, undeserved, and the kind of love that God has for us in Jesus Christ. It is love that loves the other person just because God created them. You love them regardless of color, creed, nationality, or any other category humans make to separate people.

As we enter into the season of Advent, let us keep the dual commandment of love at the forefront of all we say and do. And we pray, "Come, oh come Emmanuel." *-Peace, Pastor Jon*
