### Life Together

Welcome to a new round of Small Groups at Savior's. I have had experience in my former congregation with starting small groups, and it deepened our congregation's commitment, communication, and connections.

In 2023, we will embark on a journey of renewal as a community of faith through gathering in groups of 6 to 10 in a comfortable setting of your choosing. We will be using the free video/discussion-based resource called "Be Like Jesus, Live Like Jesus". *Belikejesuslivelikejesus.org* 

'Be Like Jesus, Live Like Jesus' has five 90-minute based sessions:

- Participant and Series Introduction
- Session 1: Be Grateful
- Session 2: Be Merciful
- Session 3: Be Present
- Session 4: Be Trusting



If you involve food and fellowship, it may take longer than 90 minutes. If you are like the small group at Our Savior's who refer to themselves as "The Tortoises" this may take you the whole year to complete. After this session is over, we have another round of small groups called "Alpha" that we will introduce.

How will the Small Groups work? You can put together your own small group! Or if you are an individual, we will play matchmaker. For example, it could be a current circle you're currently involved in, an affinity group, a neighborhood group, or a new group. If you feel called to start a group, invite others to join you? Find a place to gather, whether it's in your homes, the church, or a coffee shop. Notify our Director of Children, Youth, and Family Ministry, Patty Koplitz, who is in your group and an identified communication person. Let us know the date, time, and location you plan to begin.

I will offer to meet with the facilitators of your group to add a little more background and Biblical content to the message if you would like that. I met with facilitators once a month at my last congregation and it really gave them confidence to lead.

Small groups can enliven a congregation and your faith journey. Our prayer ministry and care for each other will improve. And each group can choose a mission that they would like to support inside or outside the church. It is a win-win all the way around.

I would like for us to identify our small groups in February and start in March. What do you think? Do you want to gather with other Christians and grow deeper in faith? Are there people outside the church you would like to invite to your small group? All things are possible.

Tech group - Jim inquired with Arrow Audio group with quotes for the front speaker and do other improvements.

Speaker needs to be placed in a new location. Rebalance the speakers, ~\$5,500

New speakers, replace ambient mics and wireless antennas ~\$15,000 Update video system, update projector, streaming, upgrade to full HD, ~\$25,000.

Moving the speaker may require moving the ceiling fan. Proposal to follow. Council would like to see more definition. Tech team to identify items to improve.

Team will also meet to discuss current status of pianos at OSLC. Existing selection is getting older and more difficult to maintain tune.

Jim, the upright piano doesn't stay in tune. A congregational member has shown interest in possibly getting/replacing with a Grand Piano. Organ also may need to be updated as it is aged. More information needs to be gathered into what exactly is required.

#### Serve & Reach - Diane Wilfling

Will look to direct funds differently as the Brigade Christmas giving program is well supported. Looking towards supporting Bletzinger House and possibly identifying members of the church who may need help for our Christmas Giving. Carol Swannell will reach out to Bletzinger House and see how we can be more involved and what their needs are, possibly a game night, and gifts for them, Christmas party.

#### Dear FVCT Partners,

We are so grateful that you are part of our community! Many hands make light work, and together we have done a lot! Let's take a moment to look at the ways we've come together to care for our neighbors with nourishment and friendliness through community meals.

#### In the year 2022:

17 groups from our community joined together as FVCT to serve our community.

102 meals were prepared and served by these groups because they care.

5,025 people were guests at these meals, and received that care.

This number does not include the volunteer meals, they gave and received care. Many of these guests and volunteers enjoyed conversation and community, which has great value and which we all need.

We adapted and responded to the challenges of the pandemic. We began the year serving lunches to go from the entryway. In May we moved back into the dining room but allowed carry out meals, and allowed additional meals to be taken for others unable to join us in the dining room. In June I relieved Kathleen as the Site Director, and have had the privilege of getting to know and serve with all of you. We continue to listen to our guests and volunteer groups, and adjust to better serve the needs of our community through healthy meals and nourishing conversation.
