Dear Our Savior's,

Welcome to the season of Lent in the church. Does that have as much meaning as it used to? Lent seems to have taken a back seat to all the other demands on our lives these days. But what if we looked at this year differently?

Therefore, I challenge you to practice one of the disciplines of Lent during these 40 days before Holy Week. The disciplines of Lent are prayer, fasting, almsgiving (works of love), and repentance. The disciplines of Lent are not meant to be an individual thing, but are meant to turn us toward God and our neighbors in love.

For example, if you choose fasting, you could choose to fast from your phone at the end of the day. I have a bad habit of bringing my phone to bed and end up watching countless YouTube videos about golf or travel. All this does is rob me of valuable time with my spouse and take me away from getting a good night's sleep. You could choose to fast from alcohol during Lent. I am sure those around you would appreciate it... and your body too. Finally, like our sign says in front of the church, you could fast from arguing or complaining.

Fasting, no matter how "good" it looks or how well it is done, if piety is turned inward and not accompanied with fair treatment of others, is empty.

In Isaiah 58:1-12, a good Ash Wednesday text, rather than perpetuate an empty religious practice, the Lord calls the people to a different kind of fast:

"Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?

Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin?"

Blessed Lent to you all. See you in church or see you online!

Annabelle said "I want to go on the summer service trip because I want to get closer to God."



Finance – Cheryl Timm

The team reviewed the 2022 end-of-year financials and requested council to decide on what to do with the 2022 surplus.

The Team agreed to submit a request to the Foundation for educational expenses incurred (\$4,711) in 2022. We identified \$13,625 in the 2022 budget that would be requested from the Foundation if the line items were actually spent.

We are still waiting for a final list of capital projects with cost estimates and dates so we can formalize an ongoing Capital Campaign. Requested this from council.

Stewardship Campaign – We received 51 pledges totaling \$194,615. Todd and Cheryl created and sent out a thank you letter to all those who returned their pledge sheet.

Learn & Grow/Youth - Marcus Shimon

Meeting Held January 17th. Patty prepared her updated schedule for the 2023 year so far and this was reviewed as a time. Team was happy with all her progress so far and the fun events she has planned. Next meeting March 21st.

Personnel – Cheryl Timm

Did not meet in person, but did work with Pastor Jon via email to fill the position of Temporary Office Manager. Cathy Goodman was hired.

Old Business:

Facility / Priority Funding / Finance Saving / Available Operating Reserves Account

After completion of capital spending in year 2022, Non-Operating Reserve and Capital repair account has a remaining balance of \$24,165.32. Discussion will continue on how to best utilize these funds.

Rental Property Update

The team met to discuss the options for the rental property. The group seemed most interested in pursuing the possibility of renting to a dental group interested in bringing students from Haiti. The students would be enrolled in classes at Fox Valley Tech dental program.

Committee is not ready to make a recommendation to the Council. We are doing a walk through 2/13/23.

New Business:

Proposed New Language for Holy Communion Practice

Discussions were held related to how OSLC can and should handle our recommendations and restrictions related to the Sacrament of Communion.

Motion/Second/Carried Strasman/Swannell to utilize the guidance in the ELCA Document "The Use of the Means of Grace" that allows parents to decide if their child is ready to receive communion and not restrict this to only 2nd grade children. If asked, our church will still recommend an age. All voting aye.

Exit Interview with Andrea Long

Graham performed an exit interview with Andrea Long and shared her feedback with the council. The council extended their thanks and gratitude to her time working for OSLC.

Server (Online Data Storage) Strategy

Current Servers are no longer being supported past October 2023. Multiple options for replacement were discussed with the TEC team. Minimum costs to replace our server would start at \$6,500 and ranged up to \$13,500.

The team is also investigating the option to no longer having physical hardware/servers and using online cloud-based storage.

Appleton Synod Summary

The Appleton Synod is a sub group of the Northeast Wisconsin ELCA Synod. A meeting was held where they presented their annual review and the showed the work and grants that they have been doing with the money they receive.
