Minister’s Message

A Blessed Fall to you all! I have been starting out Bible studies and meetings with a “getting to know you” question: “What is your favorite fall food or drink?” I love hearing your answers. So far, I am really loving the pumpkin shake at Tom’s Drive-In. I think they mix in real pumpkin. It is so yummy!

I have been involved in a Grant-funded leadership cohort for Wisconsin ELCA pastors. It ends in October with a retreat on Washington Island. It is a process called *Faithful Innovation*. Each pastor presents an adaptive challenge that they don’t know how to solve in their congregation. But through a process of listening and experimenting inside and outside the congregation, an answer may bubble up to help the congregation adapt to the challenge and usher them into the future.

My adaptive challenge is: “I am afraid we have lost connection with our neighbors and our community as a congregation.” Although, I must say, with intentional listening work, adding programming in church, and paying attention to local challenges, we are heading in the right direction. But I am trying to find ways to connect with all of you and our community in a more intentional way.

One of my experiments to connect with the community and our people is to start “Coffee Talks with Pastor Jon” on Thursdays at Shellattes. We meet from 8:15-10 AM on Thursdays (However I do have a conflict on Oct 12). Our first prompt for discussion was “What keeps you up at night?” I heard anything from health challenges, to thinking about death and dying, to worrying about children or grandchildren, to wondering how long a person can stay in their home, to concerns about the climate or the war in Ukraine. The people who showed up made new connections with others in the church. We concluded with Bible verses and prayer...

Matthew 11:28 ~ “Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest;” and, Psalm 46:10 ~ “Be still and know that I am God.” People who overheard us talking in the next room came and gave us a thumbs up. I plan to be

there for “Coffee Talks” on October 5, 19, and 26 at 8:15. Come and see!

Finally, I want to thank Nancy Freier for putting together our Voice newsletter during our transition to new staff. Coming in November we will be migrating to a new communication format. We will combine *The Voice* and *The Informer* into a weekly newsletter using a tool called “Mailchimp.” It will give us much greater capability to add photos, links, and video. We will also continue to print this once a month for those who aren’t on e-mail. Joni Heinz in the office will be taking this over.

Treasurer's Report:

- August income = \$23,873, Year-to-date income = \$300,112 vs. YTD budget of \$323,157.
- August expenses = \$44,838, Year-to-date expenses = \$300,468 vs. YTD budget of \$314,501.
- Overall, August ended in the red by \$20,965 bringing year-to-date in the red by \$356.

The group put together recommendations for Council approval.

Old Business:

- Net Operating Reserves Update: \$21,200.
- Rental Property Update
 - Council discussed the upcoming meeting on September 17 regarding the vote on the sale of the rental property.
 - Council deliberated on what the potential proceeds of the sale of the home would go towards and how that compares to our mission and values.
- Personnel Discussion
 - An update was shared on recommendations for 2024 Salary Handling.
 - **Motion/Second/Carried Lochner/Wilfling** to approve of the salary handling recommendation for 2024 from the personnel committee. All voting aye.
 - Health Insurance
 - **Motion/Second/Carried Lochner/Timm** to approve of the *Gold Plus* plan for Health Insurance benefits per recommendation for 2024 from the personnel committee. All voting aye.
 - Because Portico was able to keep the cost increase to 2.5% for 2024 health care plans, the committee is recommending that the full-time employee share for the Gold+ plan be adjusted to 12.5% for 2024. The plan is to increase employee share an additional

12.5% in 2025 to align with market standard, but new information could be available at that time that needs to be taken into consideration. This would be in effect for current employees as well as any full-time who might be hired in 2024. New employees hired in the future will be under the cost-share in effect at time of hire. Part-time employees will continue to pay 50% of the premium cost for health care.



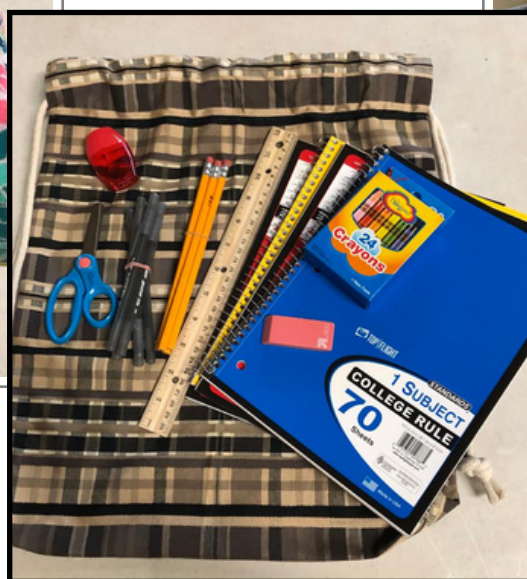
