We have an open table for Holy Communion with two options to receive communion:

 Come forward, at the direction of the ushers, to receive communion by Intinction. You will receive a wafer (gluten free available) and then dip it either in the wine (red) or grape juice (white).

Children and others not wishing to receive communion may come forward with their hands folded to receive a blessing. Otherwise, come forward with you palms open to receive a wafer.

2) Stay in your pew and use the **self-contained communion cups** (wafer on the top and grape juice on the bottom). These are located in the rear of the sanctuary as you walk in.

There are portions of the worship service when the **assembly is invited to stand**. Feel free to sit anytime during worship.



Candle Lighting Litany

- L We light four candles tonight in honor of our loved ones.We light one for our grief, one for our courage, one for our memories, and one for our love.
- R This candle represents our grief. We own the pain of losing loved ones, of dreams that go unfulfilled, of hopes that evaporate in despair.

Leader lights a candle; brief silence follows.

L This candle represents our courage.It symbolizes the courage to confront our sorrow, to comfort each other, to share our feelings honestly and openly with each other, and to dare to hope in the midst of pain.

Reader lights a candle; a brief silence follows.

R This candle represents our memories.For the times we laughed together, cried together, were angry with each other or overjoyed with each other.We light this candle for the memories of caring and joy we shared together.

Leader lights a candle; a brief silence follows

L This candle represents our love.

The love we have given, and the love we have received. The love that has gone unacknowledged and unfelt, and the love that has been shared in times of joy and sorrow.

Reader lights a candle; a brief silence follows.

R You are invited to come forward to light one of the candles to remember a loved one who can't be with you this Christmas. You can also light a candle to express a loss: of a job, a home, a relationship, your health.

HEALING

The order for healing is an expression in worship of the church's ministry of healing. Here all who sense the need of God's healing in any aspect of their lives may join in prayer for others and themselves. Here each person may come to receive a word of blessing and prayer. Here each one may also receive a physical gesture of healing: the laying on of hands, which may be accompanied by anointing with oil. These signs, first given in baptism, tell us again that we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked forever with the cross of Christ, who is health and salvation for the world.



Introduction

P In its ministry of healing, the church does not replace the gifts of God that come through the scientific community nor does it promise a cure. Rather, the church offers and celebrates gifts such as these:

God's presence with strength and comfort in time of suffering, God's promise of wholeness and peace, and God's love embodied in the community of faith.

L Our Lord Jesus healed many as a sign of the reign of God come near and sent the disciples to continue this work of healing—with prayer, the laying on of hands, and anointing. In the name of Christ, the great healer and reconciler of the world, we now entrust to God all who are in need of healing.

and help you to know that the name given to us for health and salvation is the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.



For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.






